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### Monthly Operations Report

Staff nearly completed the toddler playground bark and enclosure project, awaiting final materials delivery. The Grand Opening commences upon completion.

The Taylorsville pool rehabilitation project was completed. The staff filled the pool and all safety equipment and staff in place for the initial opening June 18<sup>th</sup>, well done to everyone who worked on the project.

IVCSD staff responded to and repaired between 8-10 water and sewer breaks along highway 89 corridor. The majority of the services were unmarked and unmapped, and of indeterminate age. No service interruptions greater than 3 hours occurred.

IVCSD staff performing weed abatement throughout Greenville Park and Greenville wastewater treatment plant for maintenance and compliance with reporting requirements.

Crescent Mills water treatment plant is stabilized but still in need of temporary repair to the spring feed piping system. Contractors have been consulted with work estimates following soon. The plant needs capital replacement with preliminary drawings already in place.

Sewer inflow and infiltration mitigation has been initiated, smoke generating equipment has been sourced, and a rudimentary concept has been developed to identify where storm runoff infiltrates the sewer system. Upon completion, significant reduction of water entering the wastewater plant will reduce pumping costs, increase wet weather capacity and assist contractors with the rebuilding of vacant lots.

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IVCSD staff continue to develop the access road to the Greenville Water Plant, which will help with chemical deliveries.

Operations staff have performed over 50 underground service alerts throughout the city and assisted contractors with service locations.

The issue with low water pressure on Alta Camp Road has been resolved, staff investigation continues as to how the main valve was left nearly closed.

All compliance reports were submitted on time and completed to the respected regulatory agencies.
