

Fire Chief's Monthly Report

I will begin by saying we continue with regular meetings, one week in Greenville, and one week in Taylorsville. We will also have meetings in the future at the Crescent Mills and Indian Falls Fire Stations as soon as they are cleaned up. I am still trying to get the pest control service at those stations. As soon as that is done, we have two working fire trucks to put in those fire halls.

Last Tuesday we had CPR training, which we learned had a few changes from last year. Most of the changes were in regard to infant CPR. Our next meeting will cover spinal immobilization presented by the Plumas District Hospital ambulance crew. On January 24, we will have hazmat training in Quincy for those who want to go.

In the last 45 days we have had 35 calls for service. Twenty-four of those were medical aids, 5 were fire calls, 3 were public assists, and one call was reported flooding. We also responded to two motor vehicle accidents.

Our training officer, Charles Schrammel, is working hard on our next three months training schedule. He has already scheduled some meeting nights with training and is filling in the rest which I will turn in when he has it completed.

We are also working on a meeting about the new fire hall with the Sheriff's Office, Plumas District Hospital Ambulance Service, and the engineer to take care of any changes and get the building started as soon as possible.

Lastly, we also helped complete the Allied Insurance paperwork and the Cal Fire 50/50 grant.
